Mentor Program



- New system for 2024
- 1st year advisors for all new officials from 2023
 - Advisors have been contacted directly and paired with new official
- New trainees in 2024 will work with Margaret, Brett and Jessica
 - In 2025, as they become 1st year officials they will be turned over to advisors
 - With MK, BB and JL focusing on new 2025 trainees
- Goal is to build consistency with trainees and then broaden relationships with members on the board as newer officials
- 2023: 16 new officials now with advisors
- 2024: 9 adults, 8 HS seniors for full check

Officials Development



- Goal: Support continuous development of officials through training, mentorship, and resources from trainee to collegiate level
- Kick-off Summer 2024
 - Develop new HS training program using USAL resources
 - Goal: reduce time to "classroom train" new officials
 - Develop track for officials who train with USAL at tournaments
 - Use Fall and Winter leagues to transition USAL trained officials to WLUA members
 - Transition mentor program into officials' development
 - Assist with 1st year officials with HS Assignor and LBC
 - Assign advisors for 2nd year officials
 - Develop content / use USAL resources to present more in-depth webinars on key topics to members

Rating Report



- Rating Committee email: <u>ratings@wluaofficials.com</u>
- New and Youth Ratings
 - Youth ratings are granted to junior officials and adult officials who are qualified to officiate youth-level games
 - All first-year officials are awarded an Apprentice rating upon successful completion of class and on-field training
 - No need to contact the rating committee
 - Ratings valid for one year
- Renewal ratings are awarded Apprentice, Level 1, Level 2, or in some instances Level 3 rating
 - Contact Rating Committee prior to expiration of high school level rating
 - Conducted throughout the lacrosse season based on game and rater availability
 - Ratings valid for 1-3 years
 - Cost \$75

Rating Report



- In 2023, completed 16 ratings at HS level
- 2024 outlook based on 88 officials at HS level and above
 - 71 officials with current ratings
 - 17 officials at HS level with an expired rating as of 12/31/23
- Most common rating feedback
 - Positioning
 - As lead, remain on tangent in proper quadrant in CSA, see between players
 - As trail, don't ball watch and count ahead, not behind
 - Movement
 - Move with a purpose, don't stand
 - Move with partner and support 8m administration
 - Mechanics
 - Direction first then foul signal

2024 WLUA ADDITIONAL AREAS OF FOCUS

- PLAYER SAFETY Focus on 8-meter play
 - Stick to body contact
- OFFENSIVE FOULS
- EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION
 - Partner
 - Coaches
 - Table

Player Safety




- Legal use of the stick is essential to minimization risk to players
- We must work as a team to ensure that the game is played in a safe manner.
- Officials must recognize, call and penalize illegal stick-to-body contact
- Positioning, ability to keep up with play, and knowledge of the rules give us the tools we need to keep the players safe.

Legal defensive positioning – 10 and 2!

Managing Play





Working as a Team



- ILLEGAL CONTACT TO HEAD, NECK AND BACK MUST BE CARDED
- How can we work together as a team to make sure these are SEEN and CALLED
- Is it excessive? Is it necessary? Is there a high probability of iniurv?
- What is the context of the game?
- 1st card to a team? 6th card of the game? Of a team?

Dangerous/Illegal Contact



- Dangerous contact (<u>MUST BE</u> CARDED): any action that thrusts or shoves any player with or without the ball who is in a defenseless position.
 - Includes but not limited to:
 - Head down
 - From out of the visual field
 - In the air
 - Out of balance
 - In the kidneys, ribs, lower back, shoulder blades or aimed at the neck or head
- Dangerous play (<u>MAY BE</u> CARDED): player actions that are rough, threatening and/or are without regard to player safety. May be carded

Offensive fouls



- Block: block an opponent by moving into the opponent's path without giving the opponent a change to stop or change direction and contact occurs.
 - When a player is running to receive the ball, a "blind side" defense player must give the player enough time and/or space to change directions.
- Charge: charge, bare, shoulder, or back into an opponent, including a player pushing into an opponent's stick
- Who initiates contact?

Offensive fouls



- Minor
 - Cover
 - Empty
 - Hand ball
 - Illegal crosse
 - Illegal exchange of crosse
 - Play from out of bounds
 - Squeeze head of stick
 - Warding

- Major/Cards
 - Dangerous Shot vs Dangerous Propel vs Dangerous Follow-through
 - False start
 - Forcing through
 - Illegal Pick
 - Illegal Shot
 - Holding
- You make the call
 - Video 1

- Pre game starts the day before with contacting your partner.
- Who: EVERYONE should be contacting their partner to confirm your game and arrival time.
- When/where: As you walk the field, confirm field markings and the cages (thoroughly check the nets and try to check the nets prior to the goalie warm up)
- What: Field coverage, splitting the 8m, support with clearing the CSA, transition, clock management, self-start review
- How: EYE CONTACT, your signal when ready, your signal when you need help, when to conference



- Be a team...if something is wrong with the field, divide the responsibilities.
- Who is writing? Switching after every two goals?
- Someone can meet with table personnel, and someone can fix field issues (if necessary)
- SPECIAL SITUATIONS DICUSS SPECIAL SITUATIONS WE ALL HAVE THEM
- Decide who will be head official on each game. The head official will run the coaches/captains meeting. ONLY interject WHEN necessary.
- Work to get it right! Help each other! You're a team!

Giving/receiving feedback - Brett



- Coaches
 - Coaches/Captain meeting
 - Answering questions as you can/able
 - Following up with partner if need clarification
 - Use language of the rulebook
- Table familiarize yourself with WLUA website/resources
 - Clocks when to stop, when to run, 4-12 min qtrs.
 - Signals
 - Horns on scoreboard, at table
 - Managing timeouts, cards/recording/penalty time

Wrap Up



- On time is late. BE 30+ MINUTES EARLY
